# RELEVANCE TO THE AUSTRALIAN CURRICULUM ECONOMICS AND BUSINESS

The Big Issue Classroom provides unique workshops co-presented by a trained facilitator and a guest speaker who has experienced homelessness and is employed to share their story with school students. Our one-hour workshop 'A Case for Social Enterprise' is suitable for senior secondary students (Years 10-12) studying Economics and Business in all States and Territories and links to the Australian Curriculum by providing students with a well-informed case study of The Big Issue as a business. Additionally, our one-hour workshop – 'Discussions About Homelessness and Disadvantage' – is suitable for secondary students (Years 7-12) studying Economics and Business in all States and Territories and links to the Australian Curriculum.

#### **CONTENT DESCRIPTIONS**

#### Knowledge and Understanding

The ways that government intervenes in the economy to improve economic performance and living standards within Australian society (AC9HE10K02)

Factors that influence major consumer and financial decisions and the short and long-term consequences of these decisions (AC9HE10K03)

Processes that businesses use to manage the workforce and improve productivity, including the role of entrepreneurs (AC9HE10K05)

#### THE BIG ISSUE CLASSROOM

**Introduces** social enterprise as a type of business and outlines the characteristics of The Big Issue as a successful social enterprise

**Explains** The Big Issue's work initiatives, and outlines the roles and responsibilities for our participants

**Presents** the story of a guest speaker, illustrating how The Big Issue supports the personal objectives of people experiencing homelessness

**Discusses** why people work, and the role of work in fostering social connectedness

**Explores** the ways in which The Big Issue facilitates workforce participation, and how its initiatives are appropriate work for people excluded from mainstream employment

**Explores** how The Big Issue (a producer) responds to consumers in the market

**Engages** students in discussion about their role as consumers, and what drives people to purchase *The Big Issue* magazine

**Outlines** how The Big Issue makes decisions and innovates in order to capture and create opportunities to generate income

### **Economics and Business Skills**
