## PLAY: Interactive Small group rotations

- 3. Express ideas about nature and people connections with Duplo trees, flowers and people
- 4. Develop fine motor skills by "growing" the giant floor tree and finding homes for native wildlife

- 4. Explore sustainability by "making" compost with fruits and vegetable and recycled paper


