The Big Issue Classroom offers a unique learning experience for school students. Our one-hour workshop 'Josh's Story: The Impacts of Choices' has been tailored for lower primary students (years 1 to 4) and links to different learning areas in the Australian Curriculum. In this workshop, students participate in a tower-building game and a storybook reading to learn about homelessness and marginalisation in an age-appropriate format. Workshops can be accessed through booking a visit to one of our workshop spaces in either Canberra, Melbourne or Sydney or through an online class.

Describing the personal qualities of characters in stories and how they are similar to and different from their own. (AC9HP2P01)

Identify how different situations influence emotional responses. Describe the emotional responses themselves and others. Recognise the impact that emotional responses can have others.
